BANK OF ENGLAND INFLATION BRIEFING

Ballymena Borough Chamber of Commerce and Industry and the Bank of England hosted a lunch in Tullyglass House Hotel in May.



Alison Moore, Chamber Past President welcomed 60 prominent businessmen and women to the lunch and introduced Frances Hill, the Bank of England Agent for Northern Ireland.

The Bank of England's latest Inflation Report was published on 12th.May 2010.

The Report sets out the detailed economic analysis on current economic conditions and prospects for inflation on which the Bank's Monetary Policy Committee bases its interest rates decisions.

Any report which is full of figures, graphs, charts etc. can be difficult to read and

understand, but in a very interesting talk, Frances explained many of the findings in the report which helps the Bank reach its policy decisions.

At the conclusion of her talk, Frances answered questions from the audience.

ONUS LAUNCHES WORKPLACE CHARTER TO IMPROVE SUPPORT FOR DOMESTIC VIOLENCE VICTIMS



Employers across Northern Ireland are being urged to show their support for victims of domestic violence by signing up to a major new programme launched on Tuesday 8th June at the University of Ulster's Jordanstown campus.

Developed by ONUS, a social economy business that profit sheds to Women's Aid ABCLN, the Workplace Charter on Domestic Violence provides businesses with essential advice and practical training to help and support staff suffering from domestic violence. It also enables employers to have their commitments to improving duty-of-care honoured with Gold, Silver or Bronze Charter Awards.

ONUS is a specialist training and consultancy service committed to working with employers to put necessary measures in place to ensure support for employees who are victims of abuse. The programme has already enabled a number of launch organisations to develop an effective workplace policy for dealing with the domestic violence issue.

Speaking at the launch, Colette Stewart, Business Manager from ONUS, said: "Domestic abuse in Northern Ireland remains a serious issue with one-in-four women and one-in-nine men likely to experience domestic violence at some point in their lives. For employers this presents a challenge as many organisations wrongly believe this is a not a workplace concern. We know that developing a policy can appear daunting, but it doesn't have to be. We developed this Charter to help firms support their staff with simple steps like giving employees practical and confidential information about seeking help or exploring flexible working hours".

MCKEEVER GROUP INVESTS £1.5MILLION IN HISTORIC HOTEL



An ambitious £1.5 million refurbishment project has been unveiled at one of County Antrim's best-known hotels by its new owners.

The Adair Arms Hotel in Ballymena was bought by the McKeever Hotel group – owners of Corr's Corner Hotel and the Dunsilly Hotel – in late January. The company got to work straight away and phase one of the re-development – renovation of the 200 seat function room – has just been completed.

Over 120 guests attended the launch in June of the new conference and banqueting suites. Guests included Mayor Maurice Mills and Chamber President Raymond Ruck.

Now designs for 44 bedrooms have been finalised and plans for a new entrance, reception, lift, staircase and grill bar have been submitted for planning approval.

"This hotel was built in 1846 by Sir Robert Adair and it was designed by architect Charles Lanyon – who also built the impressive Lanyon Building at Queen's University," explained Managing Director Eugene McKeever. "Because the façade of the hotel is listed, we are very conscious that we are retaining the original charm of the building while adding all the modern conveniences inside," he added.

Each of the bedrooms is unique and will be designed to emphasise the character of the original building

Both the menu and the design of the bar and grill area will have similarities to the McKeever groups other successful hotels. "Both Corr's and Dunsilly incorporate lots of stonework, cosy booths, sumptuous carpeting and beautiful lighting. We've already changed the menu to a less formal offering that is served all day long," Mr McKeever added.

The Adair Arms employs 40 people and is the only hotel in the town centre of Ballymena.

"The Adair Arms fits perfectly into our portfolio of hotels and it gives us the chance to bring a great food and excellent conference facilities to the heart of this county Antrim town," he added.

Chamber President Raymond Ruck said "Chamber is delighted with this major investment in the Adair Arms Hotel. Tourism will be a growth area in the years ahead and this investment will help not only the Adair Arms but also Ballymena to tap this lucrative market. I wish the McKeever Hotel Group every success with this venture".

LAUNCH OF THE PENNYBRIDGE BUSINESS WATCH AREA



The Action Committee of the Pennybridge Traders, Ballymena Borough Chamber of Commerce and Industry, local PSNI and the District Policing Partnership (DPP) launched Pennybridge Business Watch Area on Monday 16th August 2010, the first of its kind in Northern Ireland.

Pennybridge Business Watch Area will mean that traders will work together to monitor any suspicious activity taking place on the estate, they will share information with one another, report their concerns to an Action Committee member, who will in turn pass that information to the local police. The Police will email crime prevention warnings to other traders on the estate and target their resources to address concerns. The Pennybridge Business Watch Area has been set up in response to criminal activity in the recent past, which has impacted on business confidence and in some occasions the viability of the business enterprise. There is also the concern that in times of economic uncertainty criminals will continue to target

viable businesses.

Ballymena PSNI has funded the production of the first batch of the Business Watch signs, and they will be prominently displayed on a number of business premises throughout the estate. Any traders who wish to display a sign should contact a member of the Action Committee or the Chamber of Commerce and Industry.

Mrs Audrey Wales MBE, member of the Chamber of Commerce & Industry and the DPP said "It is important that businesses in Pennybridge realise that they could be the target of criminals. And it is a well-known fact that before a crime takes place

professional criminals will 'case the joint', visit the business on some pretext or other. Business Watch will make owners and staff of businesses in Pennybridge, more security conscious, more aware of people that call at the business for no good reason and suspicious vehicles on the estate. Business watch will mean that businesses will now share that information with one another, a member of the Action Committee and the local PSNI. In short we all have to work together to prevent crime and Business Watch signs will send out a clear message to any would-be criminal that you are being watched! Further crime prevention measures will be pursued in the following months".

Mayor Maurice Mills said that he was delighted to be present at the launch. "This is the first scheme of its kind in Northern Ireland – another precedent for Ballymena. The message is quite clear. The traders have had enough, criminals are not welcome and we are all determined that the rule of the law will apply in Pennybridge. I thank the PSNI for making this a priority. This demonstrates that we all care about our businesses in Ballymena".

PSNI Chief Inspector Ryan Henderson said "The PSNI is happy to support this scheme. It is a great example of the community working together to make this a safer area to do business. I am confident that Business Watch will make a difference".

RETAIL CRIME SEMINAR

As we fast approach the most important time of the year for the retail industry, it is time to consider that it is not just the retail sector that is at its busiest, but the retail thief is also working flat-out. Ballymena, like all other areas, has been experiencing increased levels of retail theft and this problem is especially prevalent over the Nov to Jan period.

The current retail criminal falls into two main categories the first of which is the amateur who will take whatever opportunity arises to steal goods. They will use times that are busy or when staff are distracted to commit thefts and will lift anything available.

The second category is the professionals who are ever more sophisticated in their operations. They will normally carry out scans of your premises noting CCTV installations, black spots, staffing levels, security detector equipment (will check if functioning) and if radio link is installed. The professionals, having done their homework, will then use a variety of

methods to carry out the thefts. In order to make sure that you have the most up to date information on this, it has been decided to arrange another retail theft seminar, similar to last year, on Tuesday 26th Oct at 5.45pm in Montgomery's, Ballymoney St.

The seminar is being organised by Ballymena Borough Chamber of Commerce and Industry, Ballymena District Policing Partnership, Ballymena Retailers Against Crime and the PSNI. The Ballymena Town Dev Co is supporting this initiative.

The Police Town Beat Team will be delivering leaflets with all the details later this month.
