GROWING YOUR BUSINESS IN A RECESSION

To mark the launch of Impact North East, a series of events and workshops were organised across the Region in the last week of September.

The events covered many of the current key issues in business such as exporting and business development. Impact North East has been developed by a range of public and private sector bodies who are working collectively to provide advice, expertise and support to the local business community.

Ballymena Borough Chamber of Commerce and Industry, Ulster Bank, Invest Northern Ireland and Ballymena Borough Council jointly hosted a business breakfast in the Braid on the Thursday morning, the topic for the breakfast being "Growing your business in a recession". There was an excellent turnout of local businesses, with over 70 people in attendance.

The keynote speaker was Philip Bain from Shredbank. Philip and a partner started Shredbank in 2007, just weeks after the collapse of Northern Rock. Shredbank provides a document shredding service and is now a recognised leader in this area. Shredbank have won the NI Chamber of Commerce Most Promising New Business Award and Philip was also named as Entrepreneur of the Year.

In his address he explained why Shredbank had grown in a recession.

These were some of his main points:

- be completely focussed on the customer
- be flexible and responsive
- focus on one thing and do it well
- identify your strengths and weaknesses and act to improve and correct
- sales growth is not always paramount. There is no point winning huge new orders if they are not profitable or cause you to loose direction
- · all staff must have the correct attitude
