THE OFFICIAL LAUNCH OF A NEW ERA OF THE ADAIR ARMS HOTEL

Illuminating the character of yesterday and capturing the ambience of today, it is an exciting era for the Adair Arms Hotel.

Thursday 24th May 2012 saw the official launch of the new look Adair Arms Hotel in the heart of Ballymena. Eugene and Catherine McKeever, owners of the Adair Arms Hotel which is part of the McKeever Hotel Group, invited the Mayor of Ballymena, Councillor Hubert Nicholl, Mrs Diane Poole O.B.E. The renovations and refurbishments have taken 18 months at a cost of $\pounds 2M$ and have not only secured the jobs of the existing staff, but will create an additional 10 jobs in the next twelve months.

Throughout the process, local designers, planners and builders have been used to help sensitively redevelop the hotel, retaining the original charm of the beautifully gabled façade constructed in basalt and Dungannon sandstone. Many modern conveniences have been added, including a magnificent 200 seater banqueting suite and conference room, newly designed bedrooms, each of which are unique and emphasise the character of the original building. A new entrance, reception, lift, staircase and grill bar have also been added.

But the characteristics and comfort of a family run hotel still prevail. From the Adair family, the original owners to the McKeever family, the current owners, the attention to detail and personal service can be experienced throughout every aspect of the hotel, from the reception to the relaxing bedrooms. The lobby, bar and grill areas, which incorporate lots of stonework, cosy booths, sumptuous carpeting and beautiful lighting now offers customers an extensive selection from light snacks to main meals all day, every day.

There is no doubt that the Adair Arms Hotel will continue to play an important role in the proud history of Ballymena for many years to come.

Speaking at the official launch Eugene McKeever said, "We are extremely pleased with the work done to the hotel and proud that it will continue to play an important part in the life of Ballymena. The beautiful façade, that so many people through the years are familiar with, will remain and the renovations mean that the hotel can continue to provide the people of Ballymena and visiting tourists and guests with a warm welcome and a enjoyable, comfortable and memorable visit."

TOWN CENTRE SAFETY WARDENS BACK ON THE STREETS OF BALLYMENA

The Town Centre Safety Wardens have made a welcome return to the streets of Ballymena following renewal of funding from the Department of Justice through the newly formed Ballymena Policing and Community Safety Partnership.

This project follows on from a highly successful pilot project that ran from Sept 2011 to March 2012. Due to the positive evaluation a further offer of funding was received for the 2012/2013 year. A new tendering process was required and the winner on this occasion was Mercury Security from Lisburn.

The Police and Community Safety Partnership Chairperson, Councillor Audrey Wales, commented *"We are extremely pleased to have the Wardens back again for another year, as they were very successful during the pilot project. The Wardens provide a reassuring presence in the Town Centre and are a focal point for resolving day to day problems that arise within the Town Centre".*

Ballymena Retailers Against Crime are the project administrators on behalf of Ballymena Borough Council by means of a service level agreement and will be managing the day to day operation of the project until March 13.

The BRAC Development Manager, Trevor Parker, agreed with the comments of Councillor Wales and added *"The Warden Project is now up and running again following the support received from Ballymena Borough Council and the newly formed Police and Community Safety Partnership. The new Wardens will be liaising closely with both the local traders and the general public to ensure that Ballymena remains a first class experience for all Town Centre users".*

Mayor Alderman PJ McAvoy also added that "The Town Centre Wardens proved to be a great success during the pilot project and Ballymena Council is pleased to have them back on the streets again addressing any issues that arise in the Town Centre".

BALLYMENA OFFERS A SAFE PLACE FOR PEOPLE LIVING WITH DOMESTIC ABUSE

Ballymena social economy business Onus, supported by Ballymena Borough Council, PSNI and Ballymena businesses and organisations recently launched a new initiative to raise awareness of services available for anyone experiencing domestic abuse.

Mayor of Ballymena, Alderman PJ McAvoy, welcomed the organisations along to the event in the Braid Arts Centre, and thanked them for supporting the work of Onus by providing a Safe Place for victims of domestic abuse to access information on support available in the town.

He said: 'We know that there is this silent problem of domestic abuse in our town, no different from any other town, and Ballymena Borough Council are working with Onus in trying to get the message out that there is support for people living and working here. We are working towards Ballymena becoming a Safe Town for victims of domestic abuse'.

Colette Stewart, Onus Business Manager, explains the rationale behind the scheme:

'Many people living with domestic abuse are not aware of the range of services available to support them. We need to get that information out there, into businesses, council premises, Church and community organisations, constituency offices and anywhere there's a large volume of people passing through. Given the statistics, that domestic abuse impacts upon an estimated 1 in 4 families, many businesses and organisations will have people living with abuse passing through their premises on a daily basis. We want those people to see the Safe Place logo and to know that the community in Ballymena does not support domestic abuse, and no-one need live with it. We are very grateful to those businesses and organisations who are working with us in getting this information out to those who need it'.

A diverse range of Ballymena businesses were also awarded Charters at the 3rd Annual Workplace Charter Awards Ceremony, including Ballymena Borough Council, Ballymena Chamber of Commerce, Robin Swann MLA constituency office, Ballymena Methodist Church, Vineyard Ballymena, Ballyloughan Church, Front Page Bar, Montgomerys, Connections Plus, and Ballymena GPs.
